The Apostle Paul's second missionary journey began with these words: *“Let us go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they do.”* (Acts 15:36).

Andrew Wommack has obeyed a call to minister beyond the borders of his own country and requires the same for each student attending Charis Bible College. The importance of ministering in a foreign culture, where God's Word may not be as accessible or widely spread as it is in the US, has always been close to Andrew's heart.

The ministry has the potential to reach 3.2 billion people worldwide, and for Andrew, meeting people face to face, delivering the message of God's grace, and hearing how God's

Word is changing their lives is the reward. Like the Apostle Paul, he wants to “see how they do.” On 11th October 2018, Andrew's partners enabled him to fly to England for the annual European Ministers' Conference at Charis Walsall. There, ministers from 14 nations gathered to revitalise their ministries' goals. With the support of Bob Yandian, Andrew challenged them to raise their voices against mainstream Christian labels and bias in the media, education, and government.

From England, Andrew flew to Kampala, Uganda, and had lunch with Apostle Grace Lubega. Apostle Grace is a young pastor who, in just four years, has built a phenomenal church of 7,000 with a live stream

to 55,000 across eastern Africa, spreading the grace message. While there, Andrew witnessed 350 members of Apostle Grace's church prepare the football field at the Lugogo Sports Complex for a Gospel Truth Seminar, setting up 8,000 chairs for what would be the largest crowd Andrew had ever ministered to. That evening, the field filled with worshippers, a testimony to the impact that the Good News has had on Ugandans since 2002.

As Andrew took to the stage, the power went out, yet no one left. Across the field, voices raised in song, worshipping God. When the power came on again, Andrew continued his teaching and 800 believers responded to receive the baptism

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of the Holy Spirit, with dozens being born again. You could almost hear the shackles of religious bondage falling to the ground.

He saw the growth of the ministry even more in a meeting with 300 local pastors. This was a true milestone for the Gospel! Since the Protestant culture in Africa has been dominated by pastors who wield absolute power through intimidation and fear of damnation, it is no small thing for them to give up that power in favour of the message of God's unconditional love and grace.

Accompanied by Mark Rowe and Ricky Burge, directors of Discipleship Evangelism Missional Outreach, Andrew made his annual visit to Glory of Christ Church. Together they connected with Trevor Tychon, a Spirit-led missionary who leads Connect Africa to develop technologies that benefit African lives using their own resources and skills. Mark Rowe, who has a passion for aquaponic food production, envisions a partnership with Connect Africa that will enable Charis graduates to begin Third-World ministry with very practical life improvement skills.

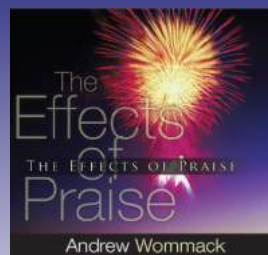
Everywhere Andrew went, he saw the fruits of the ministry's labour. In Kampala, he attended the Charis Kampala graduation ceremony, which promoted 55 students from the first-year class and graduated 27 from the second year. In Nairobi, steps were outlined to open an Andrew Wommack Ministries office and Charis campus. Andrew also had the privilege of ordaining two Charis Kampala graduates, John and Grace Kimani, who will spearhead the ministry openings.

Andrew and his group were also invited to dine with Kenya's Deputy President William Ruto. Due to unexpected government business, the dinner was cancelled, but the following morning, his wife, Rachel Ruto, met Andrew. Later, she came to the dedication of the new Auditorium in Woodland Park, Colorado, with a delegation of Kenyan government officials.

Andrew arrived home filled with the peace and knowledge that they had only seen the tip of the iceberg of what God is doing through the ministry's partners. Through your encouragement, prayers, and gifts, you are helping bear fruit in countless lives around the world. We pray God's richest blessings on everyone who took part in this 2018 missionary journey.
