PROSPERITY

For many years, the area of finances was one of the hardest parts of my walk with God. I loved the Lord and believed His Word, yet I struggled financially. From around 1972, when I started in ministry, all the way to 1996, Jamie and I barely made ends meet—and it nearly shut our ministry down. But it wasn't God's fault—it was mine. I had fear, doubt, and wrong concepts about money.

Church Myths About Money

Much of that struggle came from what I'd been taught about money as a believer. I grew up in a church that taught it was ungodly to talk about finances. They believed that if you were a Christian, God would supply your *needs* (Phil. 4:19), not your *wants*. They really emphasized 1 Timothy 6:10, that the love of money is the root of all evil.

That way of thinking may sound spiritual, but it actually distorts Scripture by treating money itself as evil. That misunderstanding has cost people dearly. I've seen believers struggle emotionally, physically, and in their relationships simply because they didn't understand God's heart when it comes to prosperity.

Once I began to understand what Scripture actually teaches, I started seeing dramatic change—not only in my own life, but in others as well. Let me tell you about Colin and April Carr, graduates of Charis Bible College. When they arrived at school, they had some serious problems. But today, after trusting God and applying His Word, they're running a business doing over a billion dollars in annual income. That's not arrogance—it's freedom. That's what happens when Christians embrace biblical financial stewardship.

Prosperity Prejudice

And yet, despite fruit like that, there's still a lot of prejudice surrounding this subject. If you talk about a doctor, lawyer, athlete, or celebrity prospering, it's no problem. But when it's a Christian or a minister, suddenly everyone's eyebrows go up. That's because of this old, misguided idea that a minister must live in lack to be "humble." That's just not scriptural.

Abraham, David, Solomon, and many others were all blessed and prosperous. Prosperity in God's hands isn't a sin—it's good stewardship.

How Your Thinking Affects Your Finances

At the root of all this isn't money—it's thinking. Proverbs 23:7 says that as a man thinks in his heart, so is he. If you're poor, it's because your thinking is poor. It's not because of your skin color, gender, or education. It's not because someone didn't treat you fairly. Your finances are a reflection of your mindset about money.

The good news is that your thinking can change. Beliefs can change. And when your heart and mind line up with God's Word, financial breakthrough follows. And once your thinking changes, the next issue you have to settle is ownership.

In Luke 16, Jesus told a parable about a rich man and his steward. The lesson is profound: **it's not your money**. God is the source of all you have. Your talents, your opportunities, your resources—they're not for you alone. You are a steward. A steward is someone who manages something that belongs to someone else.

He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much. If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?

Luke 16:10–11

Money isn't the enemy—it's just a tool. The problem comes when your heart is on money instead of on God. Covetousness and fear of running out—those are signs you're not stewarding well. But when your heart recognizes God as the source and you faithfully manage what He's given, blessings follow—often in ways you never imagined. If He can get it *through* you, He will get it to you.

Practical Steps to Changing Your Money Mindset

I want to help you live this out, so here are a few simple, biblical steps:

1. **Shift your mindset:** Recognize that *it is not your money*. God owns it, and He's entrusted you to steward it faithfully.
2. **Start small:** Faithfulness begins in the "least." Give generously from what you have, trusting God to multiply it.
3. **Obey, even when it seems impossible:** Don't let what's in your wallet limit what God wants to do.
4. **Avoid comparing or blaming:** Let go of societal prejudices and excuses. Focus on your stewardship, your heart, and your obedience to the Lord.

If this feels hard, there's a reason for it—and Jesus addressed it directly. Look what He said in Luke 16:13: *"No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other."*

There is a demonic spirit called mammon that uses fear and greed to make you depend on money. It tells you that you're going to run out, so when God asks you to give, you hold back and say, "But I need this." That spirit will keep you in bondage.

This is where a lot of believers get stuck. They love God. They want to obey Him. But this one issue keeps pulling them back. And until it's dealt with, nothing else really works the way it should. I have so much more to say, but there's no way I can cover everything in just one article. So if you need a breakthrough in this area—and most people do—I encourage you to get my full teaching, titled *Prosperity*.

HAVE YOU DISQUALIFIED YOURSELF AS A LEADER?

Did you know that everyone is called to lead? Leadership isn't about a title—it's about influence. Yet too often, we let our idea of what a leader "should" look like stop us from stepping into the role God has for us.

Have you ever felt God calling you to a new season or responsibility but hesitated because you hadn't seen a mom, dad, pastor, business owner, school board member, or community leader who looked quite like you?

At the 2025 Leadership Conference, Duane Sheriff addressed this in his teaching on the five essentials of godly leadership. **He shared how he nearly disqualified himself from ministry and the pastorate role because he couldn't see himself fitting the mold that the body of Christ often associates with pastors.**

"We need to break out of the box," Duane said. "You may not be a leader like *that* leader, but that doesn't mean you're not a leader. You may never speak at leadership conferences, but that doesn't mean you're not a great leader. **A great leader has influence.**"

Don't disqualify yourself as some sort of inferior leader because you're not like someone else. Duane reminded us, "There are no perfect or flawless leaders. . . . I just put you in the mix. That means you can be a leader."

Have you limited God by making excuses for why you can't be who He's calling you to be—a godly leader with character and integrity? The truth is,

you can be a godly leader worth following so that, like the Apostle Paul, you can boldly say, "Follow me as I follow Christ" (see 1 Cor. 11:1).

It's time to discover the kind of leader God is calling you to be. It likely won't be a cookie-cutter version of what you think a leader should look like. You will have your own style and unique giftings—and that's exactly how God intended it.

WHEN OBEDIENCE OPENS THE DOOR

What if the life God has for you is closer than you think? What if a single step of faith could open doors you never imagined?

That's exactly what happened for Eric. He felt God calling him toward Bible college, but the next steps weren't clear. Housing wasn't arranged. Tuition seemed out of reach. Yet he sensed God inviting him to trust Him and take the one step he could—simply showing up to a Charis Campus Days event in Woodland Park, Colorado.

What happened next didn't just meet his expectations; it exceeded them. By the end of his visit, Eric had a place to live. Even more astonishing, his entire first-year tuition was fully provided. What once seemed impossible became clear evidence of God's faithfulness. Reflecting on that experience, Eric shared, "I had to trust Him and realize that if He had brought me this far, why would He stop now?"

Eric's story echoes a powerful moment in Scripture when God asked a widow in Zarephath to act in faith during a time of extreme scarcity (1 Kgs. 17:7–16). With only a handful of flour and a little oil, she obeyed—and God provided for her needs day after day. Like Eric, she stepped forward without knowing exactly how God would meet her, and through her obedience, she experienced provision, guidance, and hope in a very tangible way.

Too often, fear keeps us frozen at the starting line. We wait for certainty before moving, when God is asking us to trust instead. But faith means moving forward with courage in response to what God has spoken—even when the outcome isn't clear—and trusting His promise to strengthen and sustain us.

Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness.

Isaiah 41:10

If you've been wondering what comes next for you, let Eric's story encourage you. God never calls us without also supplying what we need. Often, the first step isn't having all the answers—it's trusting Him enough to begin. ■

WISDOM CHANGES EVERYTHING

If our lives are going to be truly transformed, we must not only change *what* we think, but *how* we think. The good news is, God is far more committed to our transformation than we are.

And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

Romans 12:2

This verse reminds us that God hasn't called us to fit into the world's mold. Instead, He calls us to be transformed by the renewing of our minds through His Word. When our thinking is shaped by truth, we grow far beyond the small boxes the world tries to place us in.

My wife, Carrie, and I often say, "God wants to give you a testimony so good that when you share it, you give *yourself* goosebumps." God wants you to be amazed by the change that's taken place in your own life.

So how do we get to that place of transformation?

*That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you **the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him.***

Ephesians 1:17, emphasis added

As born-again believers, we have access to the Spirit of wisdom—the Holy Spirit living within us. He draws truth from God's Word and brings revelation, understanding, and clarity to our lives. What an incredible gift it is that we don't have to rely on our own understanding (Prov. 3:5–6).

While renewing our minds through Scripture is important, we are also guided by the Holy Spirit, who leads us into all truth (John 16:13). As we read the Word of God, we can pray: *Holy Spirit, give me wisdom and understanding. Show me how to apply the truth so that my life conforms to*

the Word and becomes who I am, so that my life and the truth can't be separated.

With God's wisdom, we can step into situations beyond our natural ability and think differently than the world around us. We will no longer be guided by human reasoning—whether good or bad—but by the life and peace that flow from the Spirit (Rom. 8:5–6).

I want to encourage you: God cares deeply about what you think, how you think, and how His truth is applied in your life. He is an ever-present help in time of need, actively working in you every step of the way. ■

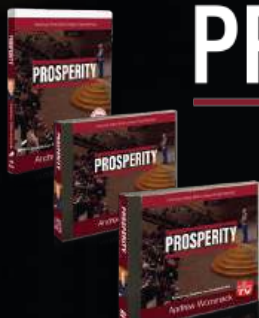
